Approve Minutes	Heather Martin made a motion to approve the January Minutes.  13 yes votes to approve January Minutes.						
PTA Special Presentation	VVE Reading Lab Update and Tips to Help Students with Reading - Amber Duran, Reading Specialist Teacher at VVE - in the Reading Lab!  Launched in 2017, modeled after Walnut Acres  Same curriculum for reading intervention  Had some success, but the missing piece was phonics, so supplemented with games and downloads, until they purchased Foundations Program (phonics) and paired with small curricular readers. All readers can learn from Foundations.  1-3rd grade, 6 students have been exited, 20 students working with Amber now  Students grouped by level and what they need work on  30 minutes, 4 days a week, while the rest of the classes are also doing reading  Teachers refer students (Kinder recommend for 1st grade assessment/intervention), sometimes parents ask, or transfer from another school  Students that don't have IEPs get specialized support rather than being in teh large classes  Parents at home can work on the 5 components of reading:  Phonemic awareness - single greatest predictor of future success  Play with and manipulate sounds - hear and manipulate (C - A - T), rhyming, syllables, "What do we see that starts with c sound?"  Phonics - connecting sounds with letters  Fluency, pace - how many words reading correctly (bridge to comprehension)  Vocabulary -  Expression -  Maybe workshops on each of the 5 components for parents  Head to website for games on site words  Most important is to read with your child - reading extra minute a day = exposed to 8,000 words; 4.6 minutes = exposed to 282,000 words; 20 minutes = 1,800,000 words (tend to read at the 90 percentile)  Demand is high for more reading support  Fluid program and collaborative with teachers
